Description of the Proposed Project [24 CFR 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

The proposed project for PR-RGRW-01658 consist of the purchase and installation of a greenhouse (25'x 50'), a Ford Transit 250 and Vehicle Cargo Cooling System. The installation of a greenhouse will require ground disturbance. The new greenhouse will be anchored to 8' spaced supports buried 2 feet deep. The water needed for the greenhouse will be provided by an existing cistern that is supplied from a PRASA intake on the property. The power needed to operate the water pump will be provided by an existing PREPA/LUMA connection on the property. The project area is located at PR-159

km. 1.9 within the Municipality of Morovis. Based on a review of historical aerial imagery, the general area has been used for agricultural purposes for the past 7 years.

The Area of Potential Effect (APE) has been defined as the area potentially impacted by ground disturbing activities related to the installation of the new greenhouse. Based on this definition and the nature and scope of the Undertaking, the Program has determined that the direct APE for this project is the location of the new greenhouse plus a 15-meter buffer and the visual APE is the viewshed of the proposed project.

A site Map is included in Figure 1, illustrating the location of the new greenhouse on the property. Photos of the location are included in the Section 106 documentation, Appendix 1. Refer Appendix 3 for Site Inspection Report.

Statement of Purpose and Need for the Proposal [40 CFR 1508.9(b)]: The Re-Grow Puerto Rico Urban-Rural Agriculture Program (RGRW) will increase agricultural capacity while promoting and increasing food security island wide. This Program will enhance and expand agricultural production related to economic revitalization and sustainable development activities. This agricultural project associated with the purchase and installation of a new greenhouse (25'x 50'), a Ford Transit 250 and Vehicle Cargo Cooling System is in keeping with the overall objectives of the Economic Development Program.

Existing Conditions and Trends [24 CFR 58.40(a)]:

The existing area where the greenhouse will be placed has a flat topography. On the surface we observed grasses, bushes and stones. The visibility is good despite the vegetation. Therefore, there is little to no change in land use associated with these placements.

Public Outreach [24 CFR 58.43]: Puerto Rico Department of Agriculture has worked closely with the agricultural community. This project will include a FONSI/NOI-RROF in compliance with NEPA regulations for HUD.

Cumulative Impact Analysis [24 CFR 58.32]: In accordance with 24 CFR 58.32 (Aggregation), there are no cumulative impacts associated with the purchase and installation of a new greenhouse (25'x 50'), a Ford Transit 250 and Vehicle Cargo Cooling System for an agricultural site.

Alternatives [24 CFR 58.40(e); 40 CFR 1508.9]

The Regrow Program purpose is to enhance and expand agricultural production related to economic revitalization and sustainable development activities while promoting and increasing food security island wide. The "Alternative" action would mean that the applicant would consider other locations for the new greenhouse. However, other locations may result in tree clearing prior to construction and/or need to fill in some steep area. Any option that requires going off-site would not contribute to the improvement and growth of agricultural production or enable economic development for this applicant.

No Action Alternative [24 CFR 58.40(e)]:

The 'No-Action' alternative would mean that the applicant would not receive federal funding to provide the purchase and installation of a new greenhouse (25'x 50'), a Ford Transit 250 and Vehicle Cargo Cooling System for an agricultural site which would inhibit the economic growth opportunity that the applicant would not otherwise have under the PRDOH Re-Grow Puerto Rico program. As a result, these owners may not be able to experience the growth needed to recover and expand their agriculture activities. A provision of the grant allows for economic development for businesses. The No-Action alternative would not allow for the economic development for this applicant.

Summary of Findings and Conclusions: The proposed activity has been found to not have any adverse effects on the environmental nor is there the requirement for further consultation with any agency. There are no environmental review topics addressed that result in the need for formal compliance steps or the requirement for mitigation.

Mitigation Measures and Conditions [40 CFR 1505.2(c)]









Figure 3 PR-RGRW-01658 CBRS




Figure 8 PR-RGRW-01658 Farmland






Figure 9 PR-RGRW-01658 ABFE



Figure 11 PR-RGRW-01658 Wetlands





the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards (36 CFR Part 61), shows that there are no reported archaeological sites, archaeological materials of significant cultural properties within a half-mile (0.50 miles) radius of the project location. The closest reported archaeological site to the PR-RGRW-01658 project area is the Pre-Columbian site Terrazas de Patron (ICP: MV-11) located 0.56 miles southwest. The proposed project is located in Morovis, at an elevation of 492 feet above sea level. Per the USGS/NRCS Web Soil Survey, the project area is within mapped soil series: Colinas cobbly clay loam. The project area APE is in CmF2. The nearest bodies of water are: Unibón river, located 0.04 miles north and 0.11 miles east from the project area. The coast is approximately 9.95 miles north from the project area.

There are two (2) archaeological studies within 0.50 miles radius of the project area, both with negative results.

It is on side slopes and ridgetops. The permeability of this soil is moderate. The available water capacity is high. Runoff is very rapid. The natural fertility is medium.

There are two cultural resource studies with negative results within a half-mile radius of the property.

This Threatened and Endangered Species Review evaluates a greenhouse installation at the coordinates: latitude 18.343256, longitude -66.375685 on Carr 159 Km. 1.9, Morovis, PR 00687, see Figure 1: Location Map and Figure 2: Topographic Map. The project is part of the Re-Grow Puerto Rico Urban-Rural Agriculture Program (RGRW) that aims to increase agricultural capacity while promoting and increasing food security inland wide. This Program will enhance and expand agricultural production related to economic revitalization and sustainable development activities.

The proposed activities for PR-RGRW-01658 consist of the purchase and installation of a greenhouse (25'x 50'), a Ford Transit 250 and Vehicle Cargo Cooling System. The installation of a greenhouse will require ground disturbance. The new greenhouse will be anchored to 8' spaced supports buried 2 feet deep. The water needed for the greenhouse will be provided by an existing cistern that is supplied from a PRASA intake on the property. The power needed to operate the water pump will be provided by an existing PREPA/LUMA connection on the property. The project area is located at Carr 159 Km. 1.9, Morovis, PR 00687. Based on a review of historical aerial imagery, the general area has been used for agricultural purposes for the past 7 years. The Area of Potential Effect (APE) has been defined as the area potentially impacted by ground disturbing activities related to the installation of the greenhouse, see Figure 3: Area of Potential Effect.

Existing Conditions and Trends:




Figure 4: PR-RGRW-01658 Farmland Protection Map






Figure 5: PR-RGRW-01658 Critical Habitats Map

The proposed project parcel 110-000-006-20 is designated as Not Prime Farmland, See Figure 4: PR-RGRW-01658 Farmland Protection Map. The area where the greenhouse will be placed has a flat topography. On the surface we observed grasses, bushes and stones, refer to Photo 1 and Photo 2. The visibility is good in spite of the vegetation. The soil in the project area has been classified as Colinas cobbly clay loam, 20 to 60 percent slopes, eroded (CmF2). This soil is moderately deep, steep to very steep, and well drained. The land has been used for agricultural uses for the past 7 years and the proposed project will not change the land use associated with these placements. In addition, the closer Final Critical Habitat is located at 55,744 feet from the project location, see Figure 5 PR-RGRW-01658 Critical Habitats Map.

Using the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system (See Exhibit B), we have determined that the proposed project lies within the range of the following federally listed species and critical habitats:



Figure 2: PR-RGRW-01658 Topographic Map





Figure 3: PR-RGRW-01658 Area of Potential Effect Map


