### **Description of the Proposed Project** [24 CFR 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

The proposed project for case PR-RGRW-03450, consist of the purchase and installation of a 60 by 72 feet greenhouse and a hangar (40 by 20 feet) and purchase of a tractor sprayer and a cargo van. The hangar will be placed on paved area at parcel 213-000-007-15-001. The hangar will be anchored with foundations at the corners and center buried 2 feet. The hangar will be used to storage equipment. The new greenhouse will be placed on bare soil at parcel 213-000-007-46-001. The greenhouse will be anchored with foundations at the corners and center spaced 10 feet apart and buried 2 feet. The greenhouse will be used to grow cilantrillo and recao. The area is located at Carr 526 km

10 Bo. Portillo within the Municipality of Adjuntas. Based on a review of historical aerial imagery, the general area has been used for cultivation for the past 20 years.

The Area of Potential Effect (APE) has been defined as the area potentially impacted by ground disturbing activities related to the installation of the new hangar and greenhouse. The area of potential effects measures 4,024 square meters.

A site Map is included in Figure 1, illustrating the location of the new greenhouse and hangar on the property. Photos of the locations are included in the Section 106 documentation, Appendix 1.

**Statement of Purpose and Need for the Proposal** [40 CFR 1508.9(b)]: The Re-Grow Puerto Rico Urban-Rural Agriculture Program (RGRW) will increase agricultural capacity while promoting and increasing food security inland wide. This Program will enhance and expand agricultural production related to economic revitalization and sustainable development activities. This agricultural project associated with the greenhouse and hangar is in keeping with the overall objectives of the Economic Development Program.

### **Existing Conditions and Trends** [24 CFR 58.40(a)]:

The existing area for the proposed hangar and greenhouse placement is used for agricultural purposes. The hangar will be installed in the backyard of the owner's residence. The area where the greenhouse will be placed is flat and is located east of the road on parcel #213-000-007-15-001. The road is about 2 to 3 meters above the level of the property where the greenhouse will be placed. Therefore, there is no change in land use associated with these hangar and greenhouse placements.

**Public Outreach** [24 CFR 58.43]: Puerto Rico Department of Agriculture has worked closely with the agricultural community. This project includes a FONSI/NOI-RROF in compliance with NEPA regulations for HUD.

**Cumulative Impact Analysis** [24 CFR 58.32]: In accordance with 24 CFR 58.32 (Aggregation), there are no cumulative impacts associated with the purchase and installation of a 60 by 72 feet greenhouse and a hangar (40 by 20 feet) and purchase of a tractor sprayer and a cargo van for an agricultural site.

**Alternatives** [24 CFR 58.40(e); 40 CFR 1508.9]

The "Alternative" action would mean that the applicant will be placing the greenhouse and the hangar in a different area on the property. This "Alternative" would not be feasible because he already has other greenhouses in other areas of the farm and in the case of the hangar, there is no safer place to protect his equipment. With this alternative, the applicant would not be able to experience the growth needed to recover and expand their agriculture activities. The Alternative action would not allow for this economic development for this applicant. A provision of the grant allows for economic development for businesses and will allow the applicant to continue cultivating cilantrillo

and recao. The location for the placement of the new hangar will be installed in the backyard of the owner's residence, approximately 520 feet from the entrance to the property and the area where the greenhouse will be placed is a piece of land that can be reached from the house by motor vehicle. The existing area for the proposed placements is used for agricultural purposes.

### **No Action Alternative** [24 CFR 58.40(e)]:

The 'No-Action' alternative would mean that the applicant would not receive federal funding to provide for the purchase and installation of a 60 by 72 feet greenhouse and a hangar (40 by 20 feet) and purchase of a tractor sprayer and a cargo van for an agricultural site which would inhibit the economic growth opportunity that the applicant would not otherwise have under the PRDOH Re-Grow Puerto Rico program. As a result, these owners may not be able to experience the growth needed to recover and expand their agriculture activities. A provision of the grant allows for economic development for businesses. The No-Action alternative would not allow for the economic development for this applicant.

**Summary of Findings and Conclusions:** The proposed activity has been found to not have any adverse effects on the environmental nor is there the requirement for further consultation with any agency. There are no environmental review topics addressed that result in the need for formal compliance steps or the requirement for mitigation.




# Figure 5 PR-RGRW-03450 CZM




# Figure 6 PR-RGRW-03450 Toxic







### Identification of Historic Properties - Archaeology

Existing information on previously identified historic properties has been reviewed to determine if any such properties are located within the APE of this undertaking. The review of this existing information by a Program contracted Historic Preservation Specialist meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards (36 CFR Part 61), shows that there are no reported archaeological materials or significant cultural properties within a half-mile (mi) radius of the project location. The closest archaeological site to the project area is Hacienda San José (ICP: AD-38) located 0.53 miles southeast.

There is one (1) archaeological study within a 0.50-miles radius of the proposed project area with negative results (see table).

On March 31, 2023, we visually inspected the project area. The project will be developed in the rural mountainous area of Adjuntas. The hangar will be installed in the backyard of the owner's residence. Construction of this residence was started in 2016 and completed in early 2017, per aerial imagery. To the west is a cut with the surface exposed. The cut is over 10 feet high and consists of red clay. The area where the hangar will be placed has grass on the surface and in some areas there is a brown clay soil (Photos 1-2).

The area where the greenhouse will be placed is a piece of land that can be reached from the house by motor vehicle. It is relatively close. The land is flat and is located east of the road. The road is about 2 to 3 meters above the level of the property where the greenhouse will be placed. There is grass and pasture on this property although there are some areas where soil consisting of very dry brown clay is exposed (Photo 3). In neither of the two areas where the hangar and greenhouse will be placed are there any historic structures or cultural remains.

The proposed project is located in Carr 526 km 10 Bo. Portillo , Adjuntas at an approximate elevation of 1,952 feet (ft; 595 meters [m]) above modern sea level. Per the USGS/NRCS Web Soil Survey, the project area is within the mapped soil series: Humatas and Maricao. The project area APE is in HmE2 and MkF2. The closest freshwater source is an unknown creek, located 0.02 miles (25 meters, 85 feet) of the project area. When a federal agency, after discussions with the Service, determines that the proposed action is not likely to adversely affect any listed species, or adversely modify any designated critical habitat, and the Service concurs, the informal consultation is complete, and the proposed project moves ahead. If the proposed action is suspected to affect a listed species or modify designated critical habitat, the Federal agency may then prepare a Biological Assessment (B.A.) to assist in its determination of the project's effects on species and their habitat. However, a B.A. is required for construction projects (or other undertakings having similar physical impacts) that are major Federal actions significantly affecting the quality of the human environment as defined in the National Environmental Policy Act (42 U.S.C. 4332(2) (c)).
