

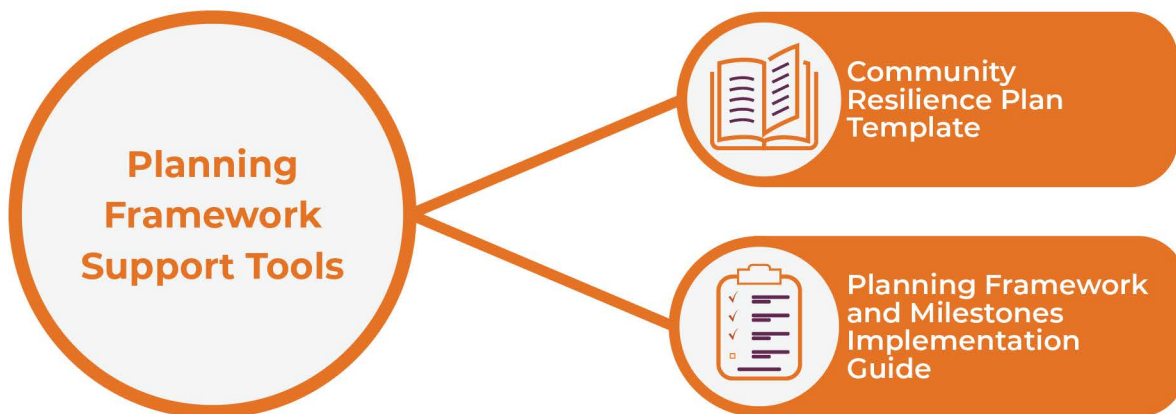
The Planning Framework: What is it for? What tools does it include?



The Whole Community Resilience Planning (WCRP) Program designed a process for the development of Community Resilience Plans (CRPs) in Puerto Rico. This process is focused on strengthening resilience and on active and efficient community participation. The process and its milestones are demonstrated throughout the WCRP Program Planning Framework.

What is the Planning Framework?

- The Planning Framework is the document that establishes the steps involved in the development of Community Resilience Plans throughout the WCRP Program.
- The Framework will assist in carrying out a robust analysis, lead by communities, that results in a description of needs and actions that will reduce risk and strengthen resilience.
- It contains steps, worksheets, guides, and concepts that can be used in the planning process.

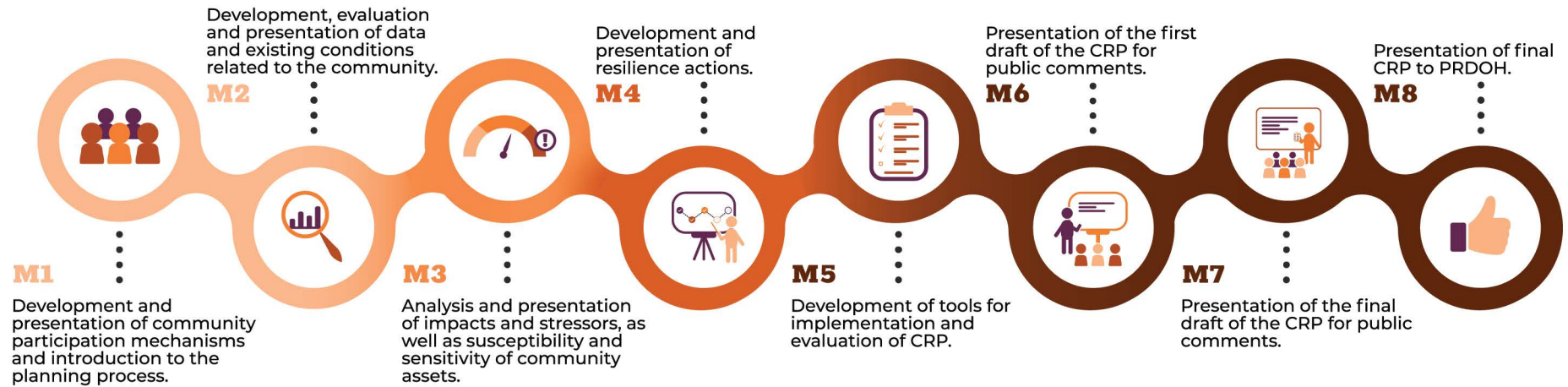


What is it for?

- Program communities and subrecipients will follow four (4) phases of planning, as established in the Framework, to create the CRPs and identify recovery solutions that strengthen the community's response capacity and its resilience to future threats, such as natural phenomena and the impacts of climate change.

What are the Planning Framework Milestones?

- The Program has eight (8) Milestones that establish goals during the planning and plan development processes.
- Each of the Milestones include a set of tasks linked to processes, investigation, analysis, community participation and deliverables that are aligned with the Framework.



What is the Community Resilience Plan Template?

- The Community Resilience Plan (CRP) Template is a **model the Program preestablished** to facilitate the publication of CRP drafts and final versions.
- The Template will help achieve uniformity and consistency among the CRPs developed with WCRP Program funds and speed up their finalization.
